


Revision #4	<p>1.1 <u>Asbestos</u>- When work with lagging is involved and the area cannot be certified free of asbestos, employees will proceed as though asbestos may be present. Any respirators other than SCBAs used in this situation must use asbestos specific cartridges or filters. Masks and filters must be maintained and replaced according to manufacturer's instructions.</p> <p>Because of the complexity of working with asbestos outlined in 29 CFR 1915 Subpart Z, and the rare situations in which it would apply, <b>asbestos related work will not occur without a Management of Change specifically approved and signed off by both the DPA and Port Engineer.</b></p>
