| Who must comply? | Owners and operators of certain vessels. |
| What is this collection about? | The information is needed to ensure that a vessel complies with the ballast water management regulations prior to entry into U.S. waters from beyond the Exclusive Economic Zone (EEZ) (i.e., 200 mile limit). |
| Where do I find the requirements for this information? | Title 33 CFR 151, is available at— http://ecfr.gpoaccess.gov , select TITLE 33 – NAVIGATION AND NAVIGABLE WATERS, and follow to Part 151, subparts C & D. |
| When must information be submitted to the Coast Guard? | In general, you must submit information at least 24 hour prior to entry into the U.S. For a voyage of less than 24 hour, you must submit the information before you depart on your voyage. |
| How is the information submitted? | The information may be submitted by one for four methods—by mail, or electronically via an on-line form, e-mail or fax. For details, go to http://invasions.si.edu/nbic/ . |
| What happens when complete information is received? | The information is used by the Coast Guard (CG) to analyze the ballast water management practices of commercial ships that operate in the waters of the United States. |
